

## FISU FREESTYLE & FREESKI SPORTS REGULATIONS

### 1. GENERAL TERMS

1.1 The Freestyle & Freeski events will be organised in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Ski Federation (FIS), except when specifically amended by these regulations or by the FISU Games International Technical Committee (FISU Games ITC).

1.2 The programme and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the Organising Committee and the FISU Games ITC.

In principle, the programme will last a maximum of eight days and will include the following events:

1.3 The OC, upon agreement with FISU, may decide to include to the programme the following optional events:

The official request for adding an optional event to the sport programme of the FISU World University Games must be presented to FISU for approval at the latest 48 months before the FISU Games opening ceremony.

### 1.4 Entries

Each country is authorised to enter a maximum number of athletes per event as follows:

#### a. Compulsory events:

- Ski Cross: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)
- Moguls and Dual Moguls: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)
- Ski Slopestyle: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)
- Big Air: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)

#### b. Optional events

- Aerials: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)
  - o Mixed Team Aerials: maximum two teams. Each team composed of 1 M and 1 W

- Halfpipe: maximum 4 athletes (per gender)

Only athletes with an active FIS code are allowed to participate in each Freestyle & Freeski event. Entries are controlled by the Organiser and the FIS Technical Delegate.

- 1.5 At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official entry list of athletes.

Only with an accreditation card approved by the FISU International Control Committee (CIC) can an athlete be considered for the draw of a starting list and be entitled to participate in any of the competitions.

## 2. PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

- 2.1 Advanced Payment:

Two months before the FISU World University Games, countries entering in Freestyle & Freeski must confirm their participation with an advanced payment of 50% of the participation fees per entered athletes and official (cf. General Regulations Art. 5.3.6).

The advanced payment shall be directly collected by the Organising Committee.

## 3. FISU TECHNICAL COMMITTEE CHAIR, IF TECHNICAL DELEGATES & TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The Organising Committee must invite the ITOs no later than three months before the opening ceremony of the FISU World University Games.

The above numbers are indicated for guideline purposes; the exact number of officials shall be determined by the FISU Games ITC and will depend on the number of entries and on the Freestyle & Freeski competition programme.

Per diem according to FISU/IF rules are to be paid for the entire days of duty (including travel days) within two days after their arrival.

- 3.4 Arrival and departure days (cf. Technical Regulations Art. 4.5)

Unless otherwise stated by the FISU Games ITC, all International Technical Officials are to arrive one day prior to their first official meeting as agreed between FISU and the OC and depart one day after the end of competition.

- 3.5 Accommodation (cf. Technical Regulations Art. 4.6)

ITOs are to be accommodated in single rooms.

- 3.6 Jury composition

In accordance with the ICR Rules, the Jury will consist of the following members:

- Technical Delegate appointed by FIS
- Head Judge (for BA, SS, HP, MO, DM, AE, TMA) – appointed by FIS
- Referee (for SX) – appointed by FIS TD
- Race/Contest Director (FISU Technical Committee Chair appointed by FISU)
- Chief of Competition – appointed by the Organiser

Each Jury member has one vote with the Chairman having the deciding vote. At the FISU World University Games the FISU Technical Committee Chair, as approved by FIS, has a voting right as a member of the Jury.
