

SAMBO

1. GENERAL TERMS

The Sambo competitions will be organised in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the "Fédération Internationale de Sambo" (FIAS). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative. The programme and duration of the competitions are fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the Organising Committee and the ITC. The competitions shall last three days and include the following individual events:

I. Individual Competition

The duration of each bout shall be five minutes for men and women.

II. Mixed Team Competition

Mix team composed of maximum ten athletes - five men and five women, minimum six athletes.

The duration of each bout shall be four minutes.

Delegation's quota

Each country is authorised to enter a maximum of two athletes from two different universities per weight category/discipline and per gender. No reserve athletes are allowed.

- Up to 30 athletes, each delegation can register two more officials (1 HoD + 1 assistant HoD).
- Up to 60 athletes, each delegation can register four more officials (1 HoD, 1 assistant HoD, 2 medical or media staff).
- Up to 100 athletes, each delegation can register six more officials (1 HoD + 1 assistant HoD, 4 medical or media staff).

Sambo quota

Each university is authorised to enter a maximum of 14 Sambo athletes and three officials. Each university is authorised to present:

Individual competition:

- A maximum of one Sambo player per weight category;

The teams must be composed of competitors who are also participating in the individual categories.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

2. PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Three months before the Cup, the Organising Committee has the right to collect 25% of the total cost of stay per athlete and official from participating countries.

The OC shall conduct the draw directly after the official registration in the presence of the FISU Technical Delegate (or his/her representative). Each completed master sheet shall be signed by the FISU Technical Committee Chair.

The draw shall be carried out using the FIAS - approved computerised random process, with the exception that the corresponding finalists of the previous Cups are separated as widely as possible.

Entries for the draw shall come from the FISU Online Accreditation System.

After the draw is completed and signed by the FISU Technical Committee Chair, it shall be made available for each participating university.

3. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Nomination and cost

All international referees and judges are nominated by the FIAS Referees Commission under the supervision of FISU.

FIAS shall bear their costs of travel and per diem (two days before the opening ceremony to one day after the closing ceremony). The participating delegations shall bear their costs board and lodging (in double room) in proportion to the number of athletes registered (from two days before the opening ceremony to one day after the closing ceremony).

NTOs are appointed by the National Sambo Federation. Organising Committee will cover their travel expenses, accommodation and full board.
